

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

This is the victory that conquers the world, our faith.

How can one be sure of your faith? Fac et videbis: Do it and you will see. — St. Augustine

Christian faith is not an ideology nor a philosophy. It is a transformation of mind and heart, it is the renewal of one's whole being brought about by the working of God's grace in the human soul. As the soul gives life to the body, so the Holy Spirit gives life to the soul. Only when we are alive in the Spirit are we truly alive. Christianity certainly has a body of doctrines, but the essence of the Christian faith is Grace, the indwelling of the Holy Spirit in the soul.

It has often been said, and rightly so, that we do not preach *Christianity*, we proclaim *Christ*. As St. Paul told the Corinthians: "For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified."

Our faith, in the first place, is not beliefs *about* Christ. First of all, we believe *in* Christ. As we say each Sunday: "I believe in God, the Father almighty, ... and in Jesus Christ, his only son, our Lord." It is because we believe *in* Christ that we believe Christ — what he himself has taught us, as recorded in the Gospels. Because we believe *in* Christ, we also believe *about* Christ what has been handed down to us by the Apostles and their successors.

It is not easy to live the faith in this secular age, what St. Paul calls "the time of this present darkness." We are living in an age of "heroic atheism." It is considered to be truly courageous to resist the "false comfort of religion" and to confront fearlessly the utter meaninglessness of the universe and the ultimate pointlessness of human existence. That is the current *spiritus mundi*, the spirit of the age.

Yet, Jacques Maritain observed that, even in this modern age of widespread rejection of faith, there are "great truths of common sense which the human heart obstinately retains even when one verbally denies them: the existence of the world, finality, freedom, providence, the existence of God and the immortality of the soul."

Cardinal Newman a century earlier wrote: "I think the great argument against this day's infidelity is that it does not, cannot believe in itself. In the majority of unbelievers there is a deep misgiving that they are wrong — probably wrong." Or as C. S. Lewis put it: "Even atheists have their moments of doubt."

There is, when you get right down to it, nothing all that remarkable about faith. It is merely acknowledging reality, seeing things as they truly are. As Christians we are not searching for the light in this age of intellectual and spiritual darkness. St. John writes: "This is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?"

How can we be sure of our faith?

Fac et videbis — Do it and you will see.

We pray that we will use our time wisely, reflecting on what is truly important, sharing our time and talents thoughtfully and responsibly..Amen.


Today is Stewardship Sunday
