FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

How long will you waver between two opinions?

I find it highly unlikely, certainly in the near future, that the church's teaching on sexuality and marriage will change. We have to change attitudes before we even think about changing what the Church says about any given question. [As to female deacons], at the moment, I don't have an intention of changing the teaching of the Church on the topic."— Pope Leo XIV

Pope Leo gave a 'wide-ranging' interview with Crux magazine in which he offered his thoughts on issues of concern to the Catholic faithful. For the most part he was non-committal. For example, with regard to the secret concordat with the Chinese Communist Party, he said, "In the short term, I will continue the policy that the Holy See has followed for some years now. I do not pretend to be wiser or more experienced than my predecessors." While recognizing that Catholics in China "for many years have lived some kind of oppression or difficulty in living their faith freely," he did not want to "take sides."

Regrettably, Pope Leo failed to make clear that changes to doctrine are not *unlikely*, but *impossible*. The Church's teaching on sexuality and ordination, because they are part of the sacred deposit of faith, are not subject to change. The Pope has taken a solemn oath to uphold the deposit of faith, and he has no authority whatsoever to tamper with it. This was stated by the Second Vatican Council:

The teaching office [of the Pope] is not above the word of God, but serves it, teaching only what has been handed on, listening to it devoutly, guarding it scrupulously and explaining it faithfully.

The Pope has a responsibility to be crystal clear on this matter. As Pope Paul VI responded when it was suggested that the Pope was accountable to God alone: "The Pope is also bound to revelation itself, to the fundamental structure of the Church, to the sacraments, to the definitions of earlier councils, and *other obligations too numerous to mention*."

In matters of doctrine there is no middle ground between right and wrong. As the Prophet Elijah exhorted the people of Israel: "How long will you waver between two opinions? If the LORD is God, follow him; but if Baal is God, follow him." There can be no compromise with the *Zeitgeist*, the 'spirit of the times.'

As I have said before, and I say again:

Many people mistakenly believe that the Church, led by the Pope, can make changes to Christian doctrine. It simply cannot be done. It cannot be done by any theologian or any group of theologians; it cannot be done by any Bishop or any Synod of Bishops; it cannot be done by any Ecumenical Council; it cannot be done by any Pope. It cannot be done by anyone. It cannot be done at all.
