This is a worldwide collection for the missionary church and it is our opportunity to assist Catholic Communities globally. We are called to share from our abundance with those less fortunate who lack the basic essentials to know, love and praise God. Thank you for your support of this important work.

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Dilexit Te. On love for the poor.

Have you ever looked forward to something only to find yourself not enjoying it as much as you thought you would? You may be suffering from overly high expectations. — Anonymous

It was reported that Pope Leo spent the summer working on his first encyclical. Naturally there was high expectation that this would set out the program for his pontificate. However, this first document of Leo, *Dilexit Te* ('I loved you''; the English title is 'On Love for the Poor') is actually the last document of Francis. As Leo explains, "Pope Francis was preparing in the last months of his life an Apostolic Exhortation on the Church's care for the poor. I am happy to make this document my own." Just as Francis completed Benedict's last unfinished encyclical and issued it under his own name, so Leo has done the same service for Francis. Our expectations have been put on hold.

This document reflects on our obligation to alleviate the distress of those in need, and looks at the ways that the Church has always sought to fulfil this obligation. It also insists that, at the present time, "we need to be increasingly committed to resolving the structural causes of poverty." This is "a pressing need that cannot be delayed, not only for the pragmatic reason of its urgency for the good order of society, but because society needs to be cured of a sickness which is weakening and frustrating it, and which can only lead to new crises." What those structural causes might be, however, are not specified.

This document repeats much of what Francis has written previously on the topic; there is nothing here that is new or noteworthy. I agree with Larry Chapp's commentary at *Catholic World Report*:

This is a fine document, at points both profound and beautiful, which deals with relatively uncontroversial topics: poverty of body and soul, economic injustice, greed, the spirit of acquisition, the commands of our Lord regarding wealth and poverty. These are hardly the stuff of deep disagreement and sharpened controversy. There are few in the Church who would disagree with what the Pope says on those topics.

There are many urgent issues that Pope Leo needs to deal with. It has now been six months since his election and he has yet to make any consequential decisions. Except for naming a replacement for his own former position as head of the Dicastery for Bishops, Leo has not made any key appointments. As they say: personnel is policy.

Pope Francis, in *Evangelii Gaudium* (the Joy of the Gospel), brought attention to an awkward fact: "I am aware that nowadays documents do not arouse the same interest as in the past and that they are quickly forgotten." That will likely be the fate of *Dilexit Te*.
