## FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

### *What has Athens to do with Jerusalem?*

We may divide religions, as we do soups, into "thick" and "clear." By thick I mean those which have ecstasies and mysteries and local attachments: By clear I mean those that are philosophical, ethical, and universalizing. Now if there is a true religion, it must be both thick and clear. — C. S. Lewis, *God in the Dock*

The ancient Greek and Roman religions were rich in mythology. Those stories of the gods are still part of our collective imagination, but they have no reality. Greek and Roman philosophy was an entirely different thing. Aristotle saw the world in terms of natural cause and effect. This fundamental insight is the basis of all modern science, but there is no place for many gods in this worldview. Logically, there has to be one ultimate cause of everything, a non-personal 'First Cause.'

The 2<sup>nd</sup> century Christian writer, Tertullian, famously asked, "What has Athens to do with Jerusalem?" Pope Benedict XVI answered this question in his impressive 'Regensburg Lecture,' in which he reflected on what should be a self-evident proposition: 'Not to act in accordance with reason is contrary to God's nature.' He answers the question, "Is this merely an idea from Greek philosophy, or is it always and intrinsically true?"

St. John began the prologue of his Gospel with the words: "In the beginning was the *Logos*." *Logos* means both reason and word — a reason which is creative and capable of self-communication, precisely as reason. St. Paul, in a dream, saw a Macedonian man plead with him: "Come over to Macedonia and help us!" This vision can be interpreted as a "distillation" of the intrinsic necessity of a convergence of Biblical faith and Greek inquiry.

Blaise Pascal (1623-1662) was a brilliant scientist (the metric unit for pressure in the *Pascal*) who had a profound religious experience. He wrote his immediate impressions on a scrap of paper which he carried with him for the rest of his life: "Fire! God of Abraham, God of Isaac, God of Jacob, not of the philosophers and of the intellectuals. Certitude. Feeling. Joy. Peace. God of Jesus Christ!"

Pascal had a 'road to Damascus' moment of vivid awareness of a God who was exceedingly more than a nebulous 'Supreme Being.' He did not, however, abandon scientific reasoning. As Pope John Paul II wrote in his encyclical *Fides et Ratio*:

Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth — in a word, to know himself — so that, by knowing and loving God, we may also come to the fullness of truth about ourselves.

No class this Sunday due to Family long weekend will continue on *Sunday February 22, 2026 in the church hall at 10:30 am.*

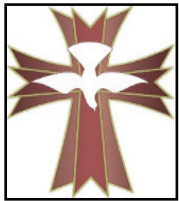
