

### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

#### Parachuting into Lent.

The season of ‘Septuagesima’, the three Sundays before Lent, arose in the first place as an expression of the devotion of the faithful. This is key. Lent is a time of obligatory fasting and penance. Septuagesima, on the other hand, is a short season through which the devotion of the faithful impels them to prepare mentally, physically and spiritually for Lent. The Church has, since the sixth century, encouraged and assisted the faithful in this preparation by appointing special Masses for this season that mark off the time remaining until both Lent and Easter. — Dr. Lauren Pristas

In the Traditional Latin Rite today is the final Sunday in the pre-Lenten season of ‘Septuagesima.’ In the reform of the liturgy following the Second Vatican Council this liturgical season was eliminated. One of the participants in the reform recalled the words of the Pope Paul VI:

On one occasion he compared the sequence of Septuagesima, Lent, Holy Week and Easter Triduum, to the bells calling people to Sunday Mass. The ringing of them an hour, a half-hour, fifteen and five minutes before the time of Mass has a psychological effect and prepares the faithful materially and spiritually for the celebration of the liturgy.

Given the importance of Lent as a penitential season, the elimination of Septuagesima has created a pastoral problem. As one liturgist noted: “We now find ourselves ‘parachuted’ straight into Lent on Ash Wednesday with no preparation whatsoever.”

As Dr. Pristas has also noted:

The absence of any liturgical preparation for Lent ignores something about human nature that the liturgy had always taken into account: the need to be ready.

In consequence, even those who attend Mass daily can find themselves, year after year, surprised by Lent.

Every Catholic is required during Lent to fast, to pray, and to give alms. We are free to choose how best to do these things, taking into account limitations of age and health. These things are discretionary but not optional. Plan to pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday evening. Tee-up some good spiritual reading. If we are to make this season of Lent fruitful, we need to make firm resolutions beforehand.

After being baptized by his cousin John, Jesus fasted in the desert for forty days. That is the model of our Lenten observance. For the next six weeks we will be preparing ourselves spiritually for the commemoration of Holy Week and Easter. We cannot fully experience the joy of Easter without knowing the weight of the cross. If we are serious about our faith we need to actually prepare for Lent.


### Three Ways to Prepare for Lent:

#### Go to Confession

Lent is about conversion of heart, and confession clears the slate. Many parishes offer extra confession times before Ash Wednesday, it's a powerful way to enter Lent spiritually reset.

#### Plan your fasting, abstinence, and almsgiving

Decide ahead of time what you'll give up or take on (food, habits, screen time). How you'll observe fasting abstinence, and how you'll give to the poor like money, time, or service. Lent works best when it's intentional.



#### Pray and choose a Lenten focus

Spend time asking God what He's inviting you to this Lent. May it's deeper prayer, patience, detachment from distractions, or charity. Picking a clear intention helps your fasting and sacrifices have real purpose.

## First Holy Communion 2026




No class today will continue next **Sunday February 22, 2026 in the church hall at 10:30 am. Parents are encouraged to attend weekly Mass.**


## R.C.I.A. Program: Oct. 2025 – Apr. 2026
