FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS

Bedicamus Domino!

I say plainly and without fear of contradiction that the aim of most men who are considered religious is not how to please God but how to please themselves without displeasing God. They make this world the first object in their minds, and they think of religion as a restraint. They think of religion as a moderate love of the world, a moderate luxury, a moderate avarice, a moderate ambition, and a moderate selfishness. Men are just and honest not for love of God, but from a feeling of obligation in pursuit of worldly objects. And thus they are what is popularly called moral, but without being religious. – Cardinal Newman

I have been attending the annual priests’ retreat this past week at the Nottawasaga Resort in Alliston. I have the usual complaints about the quality of the liturgy. Considering that every person in the congregation is a priest, one would expect the celebration of the Eucharist to be exemplary. As a friend of mine likes to say, “Yeah ... no.” We ought to do better.

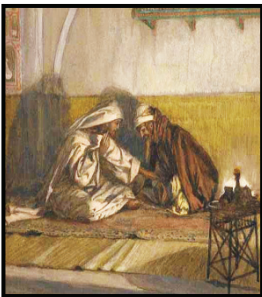
On the other hand, the talks have been quite good. The presenter is Fr. Carter Griffin, a priest of the Archdiocese of Washington, D. C., and Rector of St. John Paul II Seminary. He makes frequent reference to Pope Benedict XVI and the newest Doctor of the Church, St. (Cardinal) J. H. Newman. The quote at the head of this column is from one of Newman’s sermons. Of course I had read this before, but I had not made special note of it.

The point that Newman is making was also echoed in the Divine Office in an excerpt from a sermon by St. Augustine:

St. Paul tells us to rejoice -- but in the Lord, not in the world. Scripture says that whoever wishes to be a friend of this world, will be reckoned an enemy of God. This is said, not because we are not to rejoice while we are in this world, but in order that, even while we are still in this world, we may already rejoice in the Lord. So, brethren, rejoice in the truth, not in wickedness; rejoice in the hope of eternity, not in the fading flower of vanity. That is the way to rejoice. Wherever you are on earth, however long you remain on earth, the Lord is near, do not be anxious about anything.

Doing the will of God; pleasing God rather than ourselves; rejoicing in the Lord: there is much in this to meditate upon. Many people think that God wants us to be miserable, that doing ‘God’s will’ inevitably means doing something unpleasant; that whenever God sees us having fun or enjoying ourselves he says “Stop that!” No. He says, “Rejoice! Be filled with joy!” We are to ever mindful that we are traveling through this world, but that our destination is heaven, which is our true home.

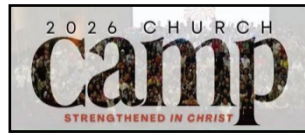
