FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Where is the Church of St. Athanasius today?

The Catholic Church, far from wishing to become absolute mistress of her faith, has done everything in her power to tie up her hands, and to deprive herself of the means of innovation. She not only submits to Holy Scripture, but in order to banish for ever any arbitrary interpretations, she has bound herself to interpret Scripture according to the sense of the Holy Fathers. She accepts no dogma that is not consistent with the Tradition of all preceding ages. — J-B. Bossuet, quoted by Cardinal Newman.

John Henry Newman (1801-1890) was a fellow of Oxford University and a leader of what was called the ‘Oxford Movement’ within the Anglican Church. He was received into the Catholic Church in 1845, made a Cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879, beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in 2010, canonized by Pope Francis in 2019, and named a Doctor of the Church by Pope Leo XIV in 2025.

One of his most important works as an Anglican was titled ‘The Prophetical Office of the Church.’ It was his defense of Anglicanism as opposed to Protestantism and Roman Catholicism. He contended that the test of authentic Christian doctrine was what he called ‘antiquity,’ that is, what was taught by the early Church Fathers such as St. Athanasius, Chrysostom and Augustine. ‘

For him the most important question was, “Where is the Church of St. Athanasius today?” Despite all his personal and sentimental attachments to the Church of England, he was eventually forced to conclude that “the Church of Rome is in every respect the continuation of the early Church. I think she is the early Church in these times.”

The Catholic Church today is sending contradictory messages. On the one hand we are acclaiming Newman as a Doctor of the Church, thereby giving the Church’s stamp of approval on his defense of the immutability of Christian doctrine. On the other hand there are prominent bishops and Cardinals who are publicly stating that Christian doctrine changes ‘in relation to the diverse situations of life and the many cultural contexts.’

In Newman’s day, Anglicans could still claim to be faithful to Scripture, although that fidelity was rapidly eroding. As Newman later said: “The Church of England, whatever it be in the eyes of men, whatever its temporal greatness, and its secular prospects, in the eyes of faith it is a mere wreck.” Today the Anglican Church is fully committed to the *zeitgeist*, the spirit of the age. There are many within the Catholic Church who would like to take us down the same path. I am not one of them.

As I stated in my first bulletin, four years ago, my faith is the faith of Augustine, Aquinas, Teresa of Avila and Newman. That is the Catholic faith.
